

Daisy Has Autism

By Aaron J. Wright Indiego Publishing, 2019

Anyone who has taken our NAMI Basics class will immediately recognize the dedication of this book, "For anyone who departed for Italy but touched down in Holland..."

So begins the agonizing true story written by the father of an autistic daughter. He tells of the impossible struggle to get appropriate testing and support from the Davis School District, near Sacramento, California. The book highlights intentional efforts to prevent identifying and admitting children, who are clearly disabled, from Special Education programs. It is a frightening exposure of the limitations and harm our current Special Education laws inflict on children and families. Some of the problems are caused by unfunded mandates resulting in inadequate Special Needs programs. Other problems are the result of misguided efforts by school districts, strapped for funds, to unlawfully avoid identifying special needs children.

The author, Aaron Wright, urges his readers to advocate for change to remedy this unjust and cruel situation facing children with disabilities and the families that struggle to have their special needs child appropriately served.

A beautifully written book and a very good read! Come check it out.


Friday, May 17th
